Even after all this time we are pleased to report that everything looking good once more for a 'traditional CAR-nival', with its mix of competition, camping, and great socials, we confidently announce that the Abingdon Motorsport CAR-nival Sprint will run on Saturday 10th June 2023.

As was the case over the past 26 editions, you are assured of our attention to detail and our promise to provide you with an enjoyable and testing event over 2 Courses and 8 runs (2 Practice and 6 Timed).

It should also be noted that we will feature our traditional pre-event formalities with Scrutineering available for locals and overnight campers on Friday afternoon (9th June between 2 – 5pm).

In light of the current economic conditions, we have also reduced the overall entry fee to ± 160 (± 30 lower than 2022) which, although a bit of a financial gamble, we hope will be offset by increased entry levels.

Overnight camping is available and encouraged with the infamous early evening Stowford House Pig Roast, Beer Tent and live Comedy in the CARnival Marquee on Saturday night as well as the 100-Car Stage Rally on Sunday.

Please assist us by placing your entry early so that we can get things in place relatively early, especially as we are a round of 7 major championships so places may disappear extremely fast.

ARTICLE 1 - Announcement

1.1 Sutton & Cheam MC will organise and promote an Inter-club Status Sprint at Dalton Barracks, Abingdon, Oxfordshire on Saturday 10th June 2023. The event will be promoted by Abingdon Motorsport CAR-nival (Craven MC, Farnborough DMC and Sutton & Cheam MC).

ARTICLE 2 - Jurisdiction

2.1 The meeting will be held under the General Regulations of the Motorsport UK (incorporating the provisions of the International Sporting Code of the F.I.A.), these regulations and official instructions issued by the organising club.

ARTICLE 3 – Authorisation

- 3.1 The MS UK Permit Number will be advised in the Final Instructions.
- 3.2 The event is open to competitors holding a valid MS UK Competition Licence, and who are fully elected members of clubs who are affiliated to either:
 The Association of Central Southern Motor Clubs
 The Association of South-Eastern Motor Clubs
 The Association of Eastern Motor Clubs
 The Association of South Western Motor Clubs
- 3.3 The event is a qualifying round of the following championships (subject to confirmation) 2023 ACSMC Hamilton Motorsport Speed Championship CHS2023/SO81E
 - 2023 AEMC and ASEMC Key Guru Sprint Championship
 - 2023 ASWMC Tyre Marks Sprint Championship CH2023/S088 (E)
 - 2023 Revington TR/TR Register Sprint and Hillclimb Championship CH2023/S072(C)
 - 2023 Sevenoaks & District MC Speed League Championship CH2023/S039(S)
 - 2023 Sevenoaks & District MC Speed League Historic Car Championship CH2023/S039(S)
 - 2023 MG Car Club Speed Championship CH2023/S060 (D)

All competitors must produce on demand Club Membership & Championship Registrations. Competitors must also produce on demand valid MOT certificates and relevant insurance documents where appropriate to their class.

ARTICLE 4 - Timetable

4.1 The timetable for the event will be as follows: -

ARTICLE 5 - Courses & Timed Runs

5.1 The event will comprise of 2 separate courses:

Course A (Abingdon) = 1,770 metres total length, with several fast, sweeping left and right-hand curves and a large chicane.

Course B (Bentley) = 1,520 metres total length which shall include 4×90 -degree turns and a small chicane.

- 5.2 Competitors will be given 1 Practice / 3 Timed runs OVER EACH COURSE with the shortest timed run on each course being added together to give a final total score.
- 5.3 Competitors may be given the opportunity of a convoy run on each course (9am and 1.30pm approximately), followed immediately by runs from a standing start, as per article 5.2.
- 5.4 Should circumstances dictate, the organisers reserve the right to establish results based on only 1 or 2 timed runs per course.

ARTICLE 6 – Practice & Start / Stop Procedure

- 6.1 Competitors will be required to complete a practice run prior to the commencement of timed runs. Any competitor who fails to comply with this requirement prior to the commencement of Timed Runs may be excluded from the event.
- 6.2 Competitors will be called in Class and Number order where possible. Any competitor who (without the consent of the Clerk of the Course) fails to report for practice or timed runs within 15-minutes of being requested MAY be refused a start.
- 6.3 It is the competitor's responsibility to report to the start line at the appropriate time. All runs will be from a standing start.
- 6.4 The starting order will be in class and number order where possible.
- 6.5 The starting signal will be a green light with competitors starting SINGLY in their own time.
- 6.6 Timing will be via automatic timing beam and a competitor's time will start as they break the beam. On completion of their run, competitors will break the finish beam at a point indicated by a chequered flag board. Competitors will then return to the paddock via the routes identified at signing-on and shown on the route diagram.
- 6.7 The position for pre-start will be in accordance with S3.2.1(a): When start timing is activated by a light beam, the vehicle must be stationary with the part which operates the timing apparatus 10cm behind the starting line.

ARTICLE 7 - Classes

- 7.1 Vehicles will be divided into the following categories (see S10 of the 2022 Motorsport UK yearbook) and classes:
 - A. Road Going Series Production (S.12.1.1), Specialist Production (S.12.1.2), Standard Cars (S.11.1) – Excluding cars in Appendix 1
 - 1. 'Standard Cars manufactured after 2000: Up to 1600cc 2wd only, list 1A tyres
 - 2. 'Standard Cars manufactured after 2000: Over 1600cc to 2000cc 2wd only, list 1A tyres
 - 3. Up to 1600cc 2wd only, list 1A or 1B tyres
 - 4. Over 1600cc to 2300cc 2wd only, list 1A or 1B tyres
 - 5. Over 2300cc 2wd only, list 1A or 1B tyres
 - 6. 4wd of all engine capacities with list 1A or 1B tyres.

Road Going Kit Type and Replica Cars (Examples are included in Appendix 1)

- 7. Up to 1800cc excluding Motorcycle engine cars. list 1A or 1B tyres
- 8. Over 1800cc including all Motorcycle engine cars, list 1A or 1B tyres
- B. Modified Cars (Series Production (S.13.1), Specialist Production (S.13.2) Excluding those listed in Appendix 1:
 - 9. Up to 1400cc
 - 10. Over 1400cc to 2000cc
 - 11. Over 2000cc
 - Kit Type and Replica Cars (Examples as per Appendix 1)
 - 12. Up to 2000cc
 - 13. Over 2000cc and all Motorcycle engine cars.

C. Sports Libre Cars (S.14.1) including rally cars

- 14. Sports Libre with 'Car' engines up to 1800cc and Motorcycle engine cars up to 1100cc.
- 15. Sports Libre with 'Car' engines over 1800cc and Motorcycle engine cars over 1100cc.

- D. Racing Cars (S.15.1.1)
 - 16. Racing Cars up to 1,100cc and Racing Cars conforming to 'Formula Ford' specifications.
 - 17. Racing Cars over 1100cc

Appendix 1: Two-seater cars such as Caterham, Westfield, Sylva, Fisher and Lotus 7, Elise, Exige and 340R, Vauxhall 220, X-bow- and similar types / derivatives.

Note 1: Engine capacity increase/decrease factors: a. Forced induction, an increase of 40%, except for 'Standard Cars' where an increase of 70% should be applied. Rotary engined cars, an increase of 50% on the real capacity.

In the event of a dispute concerning the compliance of a vehicle to the regulations for the event the onus will be on the competitor to prove the compliance to the organisers. Road going cars must be taxed, insured and fully MOT tested (where necessary) and road legal in all respects. Documentation must be available at signing on if verification is requested or required by individual events.

ARTICLE 8 – Results & Awards

- 8.1 Interim results will be published throughout the day and available via www.abingdoncarnival.com.
- 8.2 Results will be based upon the combined fastest timed run recorded on each course.
- 8.3 Final results will be published as soon as possible after the finish of the final timed run and will be displayed on the internet as well as the Official Notice Board.
- 8.4 Ties will be resolved in accordance with \$9.5.6.
- 8.5 Protests must be made in accordance with C5.1
- 8.6 Awards will be presented as follows:Fastest Time of the Day Class Awards:

1st in class (Subject to 4 entries in class) 2nd in class (Subject to 6 entries in class) 3rd in class (Subject to 8 entries in class)

8.7 Due to current safety criteria differentials between classes and categories, classes WILL NOT be amalgamated across categories.

ARTICLE 9 - Entries

- 9.2 The total entry fee is £160* up to and including 31st May 2023. Thereafter, the total entry fee will be £180*. Fees can only be paid via bank transfer. *THE TOTAL FEE (£160) ALREADY INCLUDES A MINIMUM £20 CONTRIBUTION TO CHARITY INCREASED DONATIONS ARE ALWAYS WELCOMED.

The success of this event continues to be our work for the worthy causes whose details can be found in the foreword of the regulations.

- 9.3 Should the figure in 9.5 & 9.6 not be reached, the organisers reserve the right to cancel the meeting or amalgamate classes as appropriate.
- 9.4 Entries will be accepted on a first come, first served basis. Please note that Championship contenders MUST place their entries as soon as possible to ensure acceptance as no priority will be given.
- 9.5 The minimum entry for the event is 50.
- 9.6 The minimum entry for each class is **4**.
- 9.7 The maximum entry for the event is 150 (including reserves).

- 9.8 Entries will only be accepted on full completion of the online entry and will remain unconfirmed until full payment has been received. If unpaid within 24 hours of completion, the entry will be put on reserve and the place may be allocated to any following fully paid entries.
- 9.9 Incomplete forms may be returned and deemed as not acceptable.
- 9.10 Due to the prior amount of speculative and subsequently cancelled entries, entries withdrawn before the closing date (31st May 2023) will be refunded less £30 Administration fee plus the £20 charitable contribution (£50 Total). Thereafter, refunds will only be at the organiser's discretion and only if replaced by a reserve. IF YOU FIND THIS UNACCEPTABLE THEN PLEASE DO NOT ENTER.

ARTICLE 12 – Modifications to Motorsport UK Regulations

- 12.1 Regulations of the 2023 Motorsport UK Yearbook are as written, except the following, which are, modified: -
 - 59.2.1.1 It is mandatory for competitors to wear flame-resistant overalls and gloves IN ALL CLASSES (Venue requirement)
 - 59.2.3 Driver may be permitted to drive more than one vehicle although these must be in different classes. Vehicles may be entered by 2 separate drivers in the same class (59.2.4).
 - S2.1 Refer to Article 6 for details of practice.

59.3.7 **RED FLAG** means **STOP** on the left side of the course until given instructions by an official to proceed. Competitors ignoring this flag will be excluded. YELLOW means SLOW DOWN and proceed with caution or as instructed by the marshals. CHEQUERED FLAG or Board means END of timed run.

ARTICLE 13 - Reminders

You are respectfully reminded that it is the responsibility of the competitor to ensure that they comply with the General Regulations of the Motorsport UK Yearbook 2023 and the following are just some reminders. The organisers take no responsibility for any omissions.

NOISE	Vehicles in Cat A and B must be silenced to road-going limits. All other		
	vehicles must comply with Chart J5.18		
STRUTS	Timing struts must be in accordance with S10.9		
NUMBERS	Competition numbers WILL NOT be supplied although they will be on sale		
	at Signing On. These must be in accordance with J4.1 and must be placed		
	on a contrasting background. COMPETITION NUMBERS MUST BE		
	AFFIXED TO VEHICLES BEFORE ATTENDANCE AT THE SOUND TEST		
OVERALLS	It is mandatory for all competitors IN ALL CLASSES to wear clean		
	flame-resistant overalls and gloves (see SR.12). It is also strongly		
	recommended that flame-resistant underwear etc. is also worn.		
SAFETY	All entrants must ensure that all persons connected with their entry have		
	read and fully understood the following statement: - 'Every person		
	participating in this event, whether employed or voluntary, shall take		
	reasonable care for health and safety of themselves or other people who		
	may be affected by his/her acts or omissions during the operation of the		
	event. This includes current Health Protection (Coronavirus) Regulations.		
NATIONAL	Attention is drawn to the requirement for all competitors, teams and		
SPORTING	entrants to read and comply with the Race with Respect Code of Conduct		
CODE	as published <u>HERE</u> in accordance with MS-UK GR A.10.

15.1 All Competitors, their associates, Officials and Marshals must be aware of their behaviour and conduct at all times and any abusive language or harmful behaviour will not be tolerated.
